## Spelling Stretchers:

*in your very best handwriting, write each word as you spell it out loud.
*Write your words in ABC order.
*Write your words in sentences. Underline the spelling word.
*Look for smaller words inside your spelling words.
*Add or delete one or two letters to make new words.
*Write your word and rhyming words that have the same spelling pattern. Then highlight the spelling pattern. (Ex: that, cat, sat, mat, rat, hat).
*Write your words in rainbow writing. Write the word in pencil. Then trace each word with 3 colors.
*Write your words and trace around the upstairs, downstairs, and basement letters.
*Create a word staircase-write the first letter on the first line, then the first two letters on the $2^{\text {nd }}$ line,
and so on until all the letters have formed a staircase. Example:
t
th
tha
that
*Write one thing you noticed about each word, or something to help you remember how to spell the word. (Ex: there is no A in they.)
*Type your words on a computer. Change the font for each word or change the color. Print.
*Use graph paper to make a crossword puzzle or word search.
*Use a magazine or newspaper to cut out your words---or letters to make your words.
