AP EXAMS

- Advanced Placement (AP) Exams are standardized exams designed to measure mastery of skills and content of an AP course.
- Given in May each year
- About \$100 each
- Students receive a score of 1-5
- Colleges award credit and/or advanced placement as they choose


DUAL CREDIT

- Dual Credit courses are college credit-bearing classes taught by WGHS teachers at WGHS.
- WGHS partners with three different universities (Missouri State University, St. Louis University, and University of Missouri, St. Louis) to offer credit for students.
- \$70-\$75 per credit hour
- No additional exam required
- Transfers to 95% of colleges and universities nationwide



















Dual Enrollment

- Students take college courses on college campuses (or online)
- Students earn college credit and high school credit (3 college credits=.50 high school credit)
- STLCC, Webster University, UMSL, and others
- Costs and requirements vary by college
