

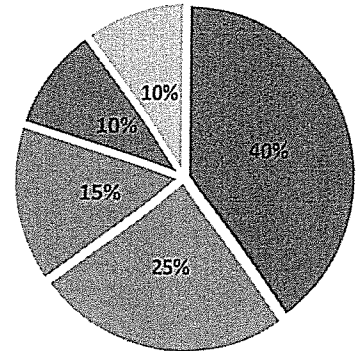

## What We Will Learn:



6<sup>th</sup> Grade American History will guide students from 1865-1950. Students will examine the political, economic, social and cultural development of the United States from the Reconstruction era through World War II time period. The essential standards of American History will trace the changes in American society; the movement toward equal rights for racial minorities and women; and the role of the United States as a major world power. The skills that students will work on during this year are: being able to think like a historian, research skills, being able to make connections between past and present, using informational text, and analyzing maps and primary resources.

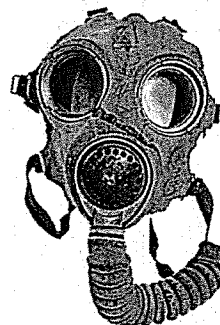

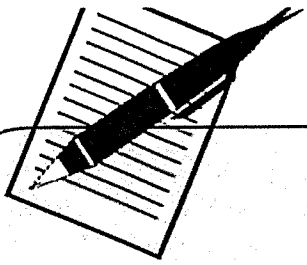

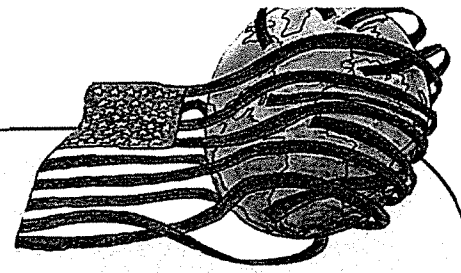
