"I will share these same remarks at the City Council meeting tomorrow night (which I did).

I'm glad you met last Wednesday, even if it's only once a year for a couple of hours. But I left disappointed and frustrated and Council member, Anne Tolan, said it best, "We're about out of time and we haven't talked about ideas and opportunities to collaborate."

As such, my humble hope is that, in the future, you use your time together to focus your considerable and collective talents on creating something new, something great that moves our community forward.

Annual events like Art & Air are terrific. But the city's mission statement ends with "a traditional yet progressive community." Twelve years ago, Art & Air was new & progressive but it's now a tradition. Same with Jazz Fest, Community Days, Turkey Day Game, Chilifest, etc., etc., etc. Webster has lots of traditions.

The Forty Acres Master Plan could have been a new, progressive collaborative idea, but it died with S&W.

So, you have a void to fill. Here are few ideas and opportunities to do just that.

And do you know where they come from: kids, who are so much more creative than adults are and they are the common thread between the school district and the community. This is already starting:

- The Alliance for Interracial Dignity is launching a great new program called "Connect as Friends" to bring the blacks & whites of our community together. It was created by a Steger 6th grader.
- The Webster Groves School District Foundation is bringing back an all new & improved "Webster on Wheels" bike ramble & picnic for the entire community on May 1, created by a Bristol 3rd grader.

- Webster Groves has desperately needed a boutique hotel for years. Here's an idea from a kid: Webster Groves is all about trees, so what about a "hotel treehouse?" WOW!
- Here's an idea to enhance Webster Groves as a "creative community": at Camp Creativity, the kd's section of Art & Air, one of the most popular hands-on activites in painting the two-sided mural. But after three days, it's broken down and put into storage. So where can kids of all ages can paint permanently in the city. A kid idea: in the alleys! Like the one that runs between Lockwood and the parking lot buy San-Sai and Milagro restaurants. Call it "Paint Can Alley" or "Alley Oops!" No need to wash it off; just paint over it. Just set up paint times, put down a few drop clorhs and paint anything you wish.

Finally, here is the biggest, boldest and most daring dream, vision & idea of all: elevate Webster Groves City & School District from a "creative community" to a new & vibrant "Learning Community".

- This is the big, hairy audacious, collaborative dream, vision and goal.
- Based on the principle that learning is everywhere and we are ALL life-long learners.
- Kids learn from us; we learn from kids; we all learn from each other. The community is our classroom.
- We learn by doing and by sharing.
- No need to build more school buildings, hire more teachers or buy more supplies. It's all there for us if we share and give of ourselves so others can learn.
- It can revolutionize public education and transform community design in America. No city that I can find is doing anything like this. But we can in Webster Groves if we have the vision, the courage and the will. I think we can change the world.

Bobby Kennedy said, "Some people see things as they are and say Why? I dream things that never were and say Why Not?" Together, let's dream of the Webster Groves Learning Community and say "Why not?" Thank you."

Hi Sara, Miki, Scott, Jon, Kevin and, last but hardly, my main man, Brian,

First, thanks to all of you who dared to respond and share your thoughts and ideas. I walked the grounds and here now is the big idea.

Preface: Well over a year ago, I submitted my thoughts on a new brand promise and positioning for our city of Webster Groves to the Mayor and City Council. I drew and colored it freehand so it is very rough and not finished. Power: the tree of life is not that far from the restroom building or the houses that border the park.
Parking: ample parking on all sides.
Concert in the round hours: let's say, Noon to 11 pm some Saturday this summer.
Now, close your eyes. And imagine Southwest Park filled with families and kids enjoying the music, food & drink and, most important, each other.
