Sampling of Student Recognitions


- Bristol fifth-grade students Michael Marshall and Nathan Fee-Wiley won first place in the University of Missouri's Creating Original Music Project.


- High School physics teacher Philip Wojak received a Leaders in Education Award from Peabody Energy.




